### **Graduation Requirements**

Complete 30 credit hours.

Degree must be completed within 5 years.

Only courses in which a student receives a **B** - or better will count toward a degree or certificate in the Robertson School of Government. Maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

The limit for the number of credits accepted by Advanced Standing and transfer is forty-nine percent of total degree requirements, which for the MA in Government program is 14 credit hours.
